



Dr. Laurie-Ann Agama is Deputy Assistant U.S. Trade Representative for Economic Affairs at the Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) in the Executive Office of the President, where she oversees economic research and analysis, and the collection and use of trade data and economic information in the Office of Trade Policy and Economics. Dr. Agama provides strategic economic advice to support the development and implementation of U.S. trade policy, trade negotiations, and the enforcement of bilateral and multilateral trade agreements. Through extensive research, analysis, and meetings with experts and stakeholders, Dr.

Agama is a leader in her field, and she ensures U.S. trade policies benefit workers, businesses, consumers, underrepresented, and marginalized communities.

Dr. Agama joined USTR in 2004, as a Director in the Office of African Affairs, where she was responsible for developing and advancing bilateral, regional and multilateral U.S. initiatives to strengthen U.S. trade and economic relations with the 49 countries in sub-Saharan Africa, including through the implementation of the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA). Her work included leading and coordinating interagency delegations to sub-Saharan Africa for negotiations and implementation of trade and investment commitments under the bilateral and regional Trade and Investment Framework Agreements (TIFAs) to support African regional integration efforts and to facilitate U.S.-sub-Saharan Africa trade and commerce.

Before that, she was an Economist in the Office of Economics at the U.S. International Trade Commission, where she conducted research, published numerous articles and research papers, and as Project Leader, led numerous Commission reports which summarized high quality research and analyses of international trade issues and provided advice to the President and the Congress.

Dr. Agama holds Masters and Doctorate degrees in Economics from McGill University, is a recipient of USTR's Superior Achievement Award, Chairs USTR's Diversity Equity Inclusion and Accessibility Council's Hiring, Promotion, and Retention Committee, and is an International Career Advancement Program Fellow.
